Eric Speece was one of Warrior football's all-time great running backs. He was a three-year letterman from 1981 to 1983. As a junior he rushed for 600 yards and seven touchdowns. As a senior he was second in the Wyoming Valley Conference in rushing with 1,100 yards, first in scoring with 20 touchdowns, a multiple first-team all-scholastic, and Citizen's Voice offensive player of the year.

Eric went to Loch Haven on a scholarship where as a freshman he led the team rushing and touchdowns. As a sophomore he was second in the same categories. He transferred to Bloom but had to give up football after an accident which cost him part of a kidney.

Eric is a Health/Phys ed teacher at Nanticoke high school. He and his wife Cathie have a son Ethan.

Of all Eric's accomplishments his greatest might be this: he's almost as well-known as his father Roy, "Mr. Ram", with who he coached junior football for 10 seasons.
